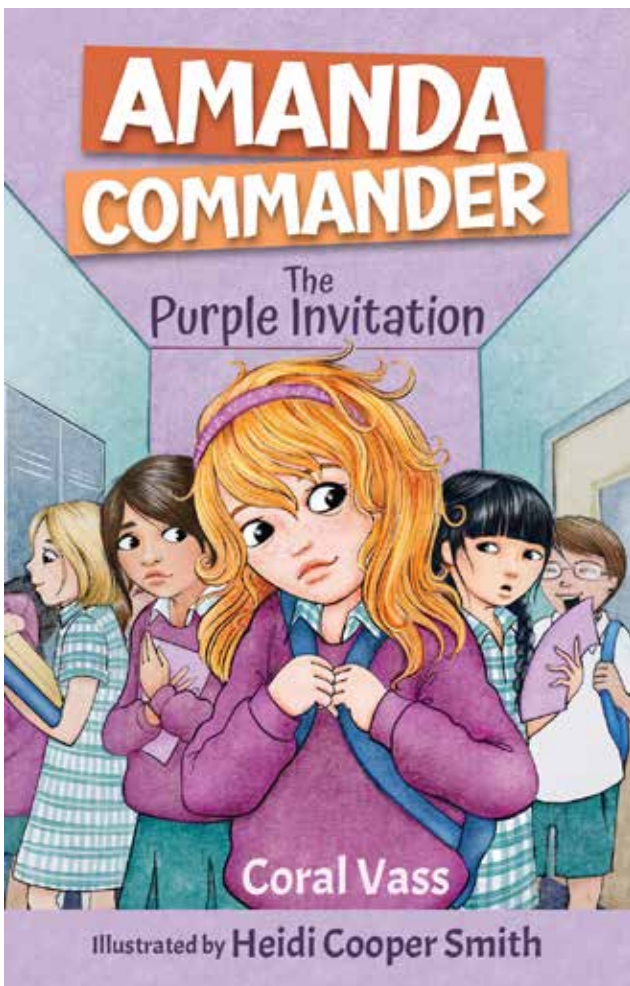

Teaching Points and Activities

This book may be used in whole class, small group or independent learning activities in schools.

Please note, the following suggestions and activities are suited to a variety of year levels spanning Foundation to Year 6 primary aged children. Some activities may be applicable to early secondary school students, as well.

Knowledge and Literal Understanding

Pre-reading Questions

1. Show the cover to the class and ask the students what they think the book might be about.
2. Read the back cover blurb. Does this give them more of an idea of what the book could be about?
3. Ask students if they can recognize the setting of this story from the cover image.

After-reading Questions

4. Ask students if Amanda or her friends remind them of anyone they know: a friend, a sibling, themselves perhaps.
5. What is their first impression of Amanda?
6. How does Amanda change over the course of the story?
7. Ask students how they perceive Amanda's situation. Does she come through in the end?

Discussion Questions

General

- What is Amanda's favourite colour?
- Why was Eve late for school?
- How does Amanda feel when she hears she is only girl in Year 3 who hasn't been invited to the party? What words in the story help you to know what she is feeling?
- How do Lucia and Mai try to help Amanda feel better?
- What words describe Lu and Mai were arguing in chapter five?
- How did Amanda describe Eve at the beginning of story? How did her attitude change at the end of the story?
- Everyone likes to be included. What are some ways you can include people at school?
- In what ways have you had to problem solved when you wanted something?
- How do you think Lucia and Mai felt when they chose to go to the party that Amanda wasn't invited to? What would you have done if you were Amanda's best friend?
- Where does Amanda Commander live?
- What words can you find to describe it?
- What is Amanda's real last name?
- What country did Mai's parents come from?
- What country did Lucia's parents come from?
- What is Amanda's heritage?
- Would you like to live near the beach, like Amanda and her family? Why or why not?
- Why is it important that a story shows us how people feel?

Discussion Questions

Family and Friendship

- Do you have code names or nicknames for your friends or family members?
- In what ways were Lu and Mai acting like a good friend to Amanda?
- In what ways were Lu and Mai not acting like a good friend to Amanda?
- What did Amanda work out was more important than winning an invitation?
- Why were Lu and Mai initially shocked that Amanda invited Eve onto the boat?
- Was Amanda a good friend to Eve? Why or why not? How could she have been a better friend?

Problem Solving

- Why was it so important for Amanda to be invited to the party?
- When have you wanted to have something as much as Amanda?
- What were some of the strategies Amanda and her friends used to try to win an invitation?
- Why did none of the strategies work?
- What things can you do if you can't have something you want?
- What would you have done if you were Amanda?

Creativity, arts and craft

- What was so important about painting the mural together as a squad?
- Have you ever contributed to something creative, as a team? How did it make you feel to play your part?
- How does it make you feel to be part of a team or something bigger than yourself?

Creativity, arts and craft

- What do you think the following statement means? "Be kind, not because of what you will get, but because of who you are."
- Have you ever found it hard to be kind to someone who is not kind back?
- In what ways was Amanda showing kindness to Eve, just to win herself an invitation?

Discussion Questions

- How did Amanda show Eve kindness in Chapter 10?

Forgiveness

- Why did Amanda need to forgive Eve before she went back to school on Monday?
- Why did forgiving Eve make Amanda feel better about not being invited to the party?
- Forgiveness is a choice! What do you think about this statement? Do you agree?
- How did Amanda feel when she realised she had been invited to the party after all? Did it help that she had already forgiven Eve?

Make Your Own Quote Book

- You will need a large sketch book, fine-liner pens and lots of quotes
- Research and collect quotes you would like to put in your quote book. They could be from a famous person, a TV show or movie, a song, or someone you know. Think about why you're choosing your quotes, are they inspirational, do they make you happy, are they funny.

Create a Mind Map for each of the characters

- Draw a circle for Amanda, surrounded by other circles to represent the other characters (Lucia, Mai, Eve and Rosie).
- In each circle draw a picture of that character.
- Underneath the picture write a list of adjectives to describe that character – for example: bossy, brave, kind, funny

Activities

Create your own mural using a famous painting

- What famous painting would you copy and why?
- What colours would you need to use?
- In what ways would you make your mural different to the famous painting?

Write a letter or a diary entry.

- Write a letter from Amanda to Eve asking her if she can be invited to the party.
- Write a diary entry from Amanda's perspective, on how she felt not being invited to the party.

Design your own HQ

- Think about designing your own HQ.
- What would you include and why?
- Draw an aerial view of your own HQ with everything you would include in it.

 - Why do people like to cook?
 - What's fun about cooking?
 - Why do people need to know how to cook?
 - Why does Amanda like to make muffins in Amanda Commander?
 - What do you most like about cooking?
